the cold and snowy winter, Lower Hay Lake is starting to show signs of Spring. It won't be long before the lake is open, and we will all be able to check out our newly dredged channel!

Accompanying this newsletter is the 2022 Friends of Lower Hay (FOLH) membership form. Please remember to send in your membership form along with your dues and donations. Now that we've successfully completed and financed the channel dredging, we will be focusing on building a reserve for the inevitable arrival of aquatic invasive species (AIS). Many of the popular recreational lakes in Minnesota are already spending thousands of dollars a year on efforts to contain AIS such as Starry stonewort and Eurasian milfoil. FOLH will continue to support the DNR efforts at the Lower Hay boat launch to help keep out AIS, but we can help individually by donating money directly to the FOLH AIS fund to build up a reserve. Adult weight: 7-13 pounds


Habitat: In summer, on lakes in coniferous forest zones. In winter, mainly on oceans, usually close to shore.

Nesting: Loons seldom settle on a territory until they are five to seven years old. In most cases, a young loon must evict an older individual of its sex in order to claim a territory for itself. Both pair members cooperate in building the nest and spend equal time incubating the two eggs laid by the female until hatching, which occurs in 28 days.

One Watershed, One Plan

Have you heard of One Watershed, One Plan also known as 1W1P? In 2008, Minnesota's voters passed the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment. The Minnesota Legislature has appropriated the Clean Water Funds to each watershed that has completed a comprehensive watershed plan. We are in the Pine River watershed, in Crow Wing County and Cass County, with a minimal amount in Aitkin County and Hubbard County. The Crow Wing and Cass County Soil & Water Conservation Districts (SWCDs) work together to manage the Pine River 1W1P funds. We should be proud that Lower Hay Lake has been selected as a priority lake to develop management practices to improve the Pine River Watershed.

The planning team developed individual lake plans to help lake associations focus time and effort on plan priorities. Both Upper and Lower Hay have Lake Plans. Upper Hay is critical for Lower Hay's activities because Hay Creek is the most significant contributor of phosphorus to Lower Hay. A quick summary of the Lower Hay plan is to reduce the annual phosphorus loading by 5% over the next ten years. The present Lower Hay annual phosphorus load is 912 pounds per year which needs to be lowered by 46 pounds per year. To accomplish this, in the next 10 years we plan to:

- Install ten rain gardens
- Have six shoreline restoration projects
- Plant 500 trees along the shoreline
- Permanently protect 1,383 acres of undeveloped land (combined with Upper Hay)
- Continue the WAPOA water testing program
- Maintain and pump all septic systems every three years
- Seal ten unused wells
- Minimize salt usage on driveways, sidewalks, and in water softeners

Funding is available to implement these projects, but the projects must be pre-approved. If you have been thinking of an improvement project for your lake property, such as those listed above, you will want to attend the FOLH annual meeting on June 11, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. at the Jenkins VFW. The meeting will feature more information on 1W1P as well as funding opportunities for projects that can help us achieve our goal of reducing the phosphorus levels in Lower Hay Lake.
